Weighting / Grade Point Average

The weighted grade point is used to determine rank-in-class and National Honor Society eligibility. Points are added only to grades earned from 70-100.

The weighting system applies as follows:

- 10% of the grade earned for Advanced Placement Courses
- 10% of the grade earned for Accelerated Algebra II and Accelerated Pre-Calculus
- 5% of the grade earned for honors classes

Rank in Class

Rank in class is reported in deciles. All courses except Physical Education and Pass/Fail courses are included in class rank.

GPA Distribution

The Mean GPA for the Class of 2025 is 88.248 and the Median GPA is 90.004. After 6 semesters the highest GPA for the Class of 2025 is 104.516 and the lowest GPA is 46.125.
